Substance misuse by a parent or carer is widely recognised as one of the factors that puts children more at risk of harm. The biggest risk posed to children is that parents, when under the influence of drugs or alcohol, are unable to keep their child safe (including overlay through co-sleeping and accidents caused through lack of supervision).

Parental alcohol misuse disrupts everyday routines and leads to inconsistent and unpredictable parenting. Children may feel isolated, stigmatised, and guilty, and may have to take on caring responsibilities.

Children abusing substances themselves – parental substance abuse can lead to children being exposed to drugs and alcohol themselves, or viewing addiction or excessive consumption as 'normal' behaviour. Parental Substance Use and the Child Welfare System

A parent's substance abuse can have other effects on children besides parent-child interactions. For example, if a parent loses a job because of drinking or drug use, the child suffers the economic consequences, especially if this is the household's only income.

Effects of Parental Substance Abuse on Children and Families

Children with parents who suffer from substance addiction may find themselves with a host of their own problems. Families affected by addiction are characterized by chaos, unclear communication, and insecurity. Due to bad home life, children are less likely to do well in school.

Iriss defines parental substance misuse as “a situation where a parent uses illegal or prescription drugs or alcohol to the extent where their judgement or behaviour is impaired and results in a detrimental effect on the children in the family” 4. Parental substance misuse is frequently characterised in research as an ‘adverse childhood experience’.

Improving the outcomes of children affected by parental ...

Parental alcohol abuse puts children at greater risk for having intellectual, physical, social and emotional problems than peers raised by non-alcoholics. Bonds That Aren't Right Children need time to develop bonds with their parents during the early stages of their lives.

Alcohol, drugs and parenting | NSPCC

Children with a parent who has an SUD are more likely than children who do not have a parent with an SUD to have lower socioeconomic status and increased difficulties in academic and social settings and family functioning. 1 Children having a parent with an SUD are at risk of experiencing direct effects, such as parental abuse or neglect, or indirect effects, such as fewer household resources.

Parental substance misuse and social worker intervention ...

Most parents or carers who drink alcohol or use drugs do it in moderation and are not a risk to their children. But if their drinking or drug use becomes harmful, this is substance misuse and it can stop them from providing safe care for their children. So it's important that parents and carers can get support if they're concerned about their drinking or drug use.

Parents who misuse substances: learning from case reviews ...

This factsheet discusses laws that address the issue of substance abuse by parents. Two areas of concern are the harm caused to the health and development of affected infants by prenatal drug exposure and the harm caused to children of any age by exposure to illegal drug activity in their homes or environment.
